The Courses are managed through Lecture method, virtual classrooms and smart class devices and ICT enabled classes. Students are also encouraged to participate in group discussions and student seminars. Online classes were conducted during pandemic with the help of Google Classroom, Google meet platform etc. The college also has a YouTube channel E- Learning Rajganj College (e-learningrajganjcollege5853).

How are teaching and learning organised for students?
Before the commencement of every academic session every department initiates a course plan, teacher-wise syllabus distribution, curriculum planning. IQAC initiates an Academic calendar on the basis of departmental inputs. The Academic calendar, Program specific outcomes and Course outcomes of all the subjects are then published in the College website.
What pedagogical approaches are used?
The college follows Lecture method, Discussion method, Demonstration method, Enquiry method, Problem solving Method, and also methods set forth by the UGC and affiliating university.
What strategies are used to simulate student participation in the classroom and enhance student learning?
Before the commencement of each session a student "Induction/ Orientation Programme" is organised by the college. Every department ensures an active orientation of all the students towards their respective subjects and college. Students are encouraged to participate in student seminars, academic activities, group discussions. Remedial classes for slow learners are also arranged by the faculty if needed.
How is the quality of teaching maintained and enhanced? How do you ensure that strategies such as effective staff development, peer review, induction and mentoring are used?
The college encourages and facilitates every staff to participate in Faculty induction programmes, Refresher Courses, Seminars, Workshops, Conferences etc. The college also collects, analyses and takes action in feedbacks collected from different stakeholders like Students, Teachers, Supporting Staff and alumni.
How effectively do lecturers draw upon their research, scholarship or professional activity to inform their teaching?

- The teachers actively engage in research activities like presenting and participating in different National/International Seminars, Conferences, Workshops. Some of the faculties are also actively engaged in Research Projects (Major/Minor). Therefore, the teaching-learning experience becomes enriched with newest materials and research areas. Students are kept updated with the latest trends in social sciences and humanities which helps them to acquire a sound understanding of their surrounding academic eco-system and also helps them in their career prospects.
- The faculties also share their research experience and expertise in different fields with the students. The students are trained and encouraged for critical thinking and to develop analytical skills.
- Inspiring students for research and engagement in research is facilitated through participation of students in different seminars, workshops, conferences held in college. Therefore, motivating the students to pursue their academic goals and inculcate interest in research-based activities.
- The teachers also support the students to complete their project works.




