Situated amidst the serene backdrop of the Mahananda and Teesta Rivers, the campus offers modern amenities, including a spacious playground, two distinct buildings, a well-equipped gymnasium, a dedicated library, and internet facilities, catering to the evolving needs of its student community.

Guided by the motto "**Tamosoma Jyotirgamayah**," meaning "**From Darkness, Lead Us to Light**," Rajganj College embodies a mission to inspire and transform lives through education. Rooted in values of inclusivity and integrity, the institution is dedicated to providing educational opportunities to economically and socially disadvantaged students, fostering a culture of responsibility and citizenship.

Embracing a holistic educational philosophy, the college emphasizes the comprehensive development of its students. 1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

1. Rajganj College adopts a co-educational, interdisciplinary approach, fostering an inclusive environment that embraces religio-cultural diversity.

2. A commitment to transparency permeates all aspects of the college, including its financial, academic, administrative, and operational practices.

3. The admission process is fully online, emphasizing merit-based selection in compliance with government guidelines.

4. The eco-friendly campus spans 10.11 acres of land, promoting environmental awareness.

5. A vibrant herbal garden enhances biodiversity and serves as an educational resource on medicinal plants and sustainable practices.

6. Security is a top priority, with clearly defined campus boundaries, dedicated security personnel, and an extensive network of CCTV cameras for comprehensive surveillance.

7. The campus is strictly ragging-free, ensuring a safe and respectful environment for all students.

8. Active engagement in community service is encouraged through regular activities of the NSS Unit.

9. Classrooms are equipped with portable ICT facilities to enhance learning experiences.

10. The college features a fully-equipped computer laboratory.

11. Collaborations with other institutions enrich the academic environment through faculty and student exchanges and joint initiatives like seminars, workshops, skill development, and cultural and sports events.

12. Various scholarships are available, including Kanyashree, Aikyashree, Oasis, SVMCM (HES), and Free Studentships.

13. The curriculum is augmented with Add-on courses that broaden educational opportunities.

14. The well-stocked and automated library features subscriptions like N-list and systems such as KOHA for enhanced access and management.

15. Soft skills development and yoga classes are regularly organized to support student well-being and personal growth.

16. Career counseling is provided, with guidance available for both public and private sector opportunities.

18. Campus-wide Wi-Fi connectivity ensures that students and faculty have access to online resources anywhere on campus.

19. A canteen is available on-site to cater to the dietary needs of the college community.

20. The college actively supports cultural activities and sports, fostering a well-rounded campus life.

21. Committed to environmental sustainability, the institution implements effective waste management practices to reduce, reuse, and recycle waste.

Institutional Weakness

1. The rural and remote location of the College poses a significant disadvantage, limiting access and opportunities for students.

2. Introduction of professional courses seems improbable due to the lack of affordability among the majority of students.

3. General poverty in the locality, coupled with a lack of parental education and awareness, acts as a barrier to higher studies for many aspiring first-generation learners of this institution.

4. The college faces a dire need for permanent teaching and non-teaching staff due to the slow recruitment process of the Government.

5. Shortage of sanctioned posts for faculty increases the workload on every teacher, making it difficult to engage in research activities, leading to limited research output among faculty.

6. Poor performance in NET/SET and competitive exams among students negatively impacts their placement prospects.

7. Increased participation and contribution from alumni are necessary to address various challenges and enhance institutional support.

8. The lack of industries in the vicinity and the disinterest of existing ones in active industry-institution liaison pose significant limitations.

9. Insufficient collaborative activities and interdisciplinary research within the institute, as well as with other institutes of eminence and industry houses, hinder academic growth.

10. Scarce on-campus consultative and placement opportunities for students, due to the lack of interest from reputed organizations, demotivate students.

11. Language incompetence among students hampers their job prospects and overall academic performance.

12. Absence of education in science and commerce streams, student hostels, and staff quarters are considered additional deficiencies that need to be addressed.

13. More funding agencies and increased funding for infrastructural strengthening are required to overcome the existing limitations and enhance the overall quality of education and facilities at the college.

Institutional Opportunity

1. The backward catchment area provides the college with opportunities to extend higher education to

marginalized sections of society.

2. The COVID-19 pandemic has created an opportunity to reinvent ICT-supported teaching-learning methods, enabling both students and teachers to adapt to e-learning environments and e-content.

3. There is an opportunity to introduce more skill-based programs to enhance students' employability.

4. Ample opportunities exist for research in the Indian knowledge system based on local culture, language, and art forms.

5. There is a scope for the introduction of interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary courses.

6. There is potential for introducing a Science stream.

7. There is an opportunity to create employment opportunities through industry-institution interaction.

8. The Alumni Association can enhance its engagement in academic affairs and career counseling of students, strengthening the social capital of the college with alumni.

9. Considering its rural location, the College can leverage community engagement in areas such as health awareness and addressing social issues.

Institutional Challenge

1. The foremost challenge for the college is to introduce a science stream, given the absence of a feeder higher secondary school in the catchment area.

2. Despite best efforts, the limited range of disciplines have proved challenging in fulfilling the purpose of CBCS (Choice Based Credit System) in its true spirit, as students are confined to a narrow range of elective papers.

3. Insufficient infrastructure, remote location, and lack of funds serve as demotivating factors for teachers to engage in research activities seriously.

4. Meeting global standards in academic activities is challenging due to the college's remoteness, backwardness, and inadequate resources.

5. Conducting online programs or teaching activities is highly challenging due to poor internet connectivity.

6. Dropout rates among program course students, primarily due to poverty, present a significant challenge.

7. Securing placements for students in a limited environment poses a daunting task.

8. The scarcity of financial resources in proportion to the requirements for maintenance and further growth of the institution poses a severe challenge.

9. Achieving the requisite standards and implementing NEP 2020 is a formidable challenge for the institution.

10. The slow recruitment policy of the government poses a significant challenge for the college to obtain more sanctioned teaching and technical posts.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

Rajganj College plays a pivotal role in shaping the curriculum landscape of its affiliating body, the University of North Bengal, and holds a distinguished position as a recognized institution under sections 2f and 12B of the UGC Act 1956. Adopting the National Education Policy (NEP) since 2023, the college has meticulously realigned its curriculum with NEP guidelines. Our curriculum underscores a balanced integration of Multi-Disciplinary Courses, Value-Added Courses, and add-on courses, ensuring a holistic learning experience for students. Recognizing the significance of vocational training and skill enhancement, we have integrated compulsory Skill Enhancement Courses, bridging the gap between our existing course structure and the NEP 2020 framework.

In our relentless pursuit of excellence, Rajganj College advocates for a harmonious fusion of traditional and modern teaching methodologies. While we uphold the efficacy of conventional chalk-duster-board methods, we also harness technology through virtual classrooms, cultivating an interactive and immersive learning environment. Annual seminars, featuring insights from experts across diverse fields, enrich our curriculum, offering students valuable career guidance and contemporary perspectives.

Beyond conventional academics, the college places considerable emphasis on holistic education. We commemorate national events such as Republic Day, Independence Day, Environment Day, Women's Day, among others, through a spectrum of co-curricular activities. These initiatives aim to broaden students' horizons, nurturing a sense of civic responsibility and cultural appreciation, thereby aligning with our overarching educational objectives.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Adhering to the guidelines established by North Bengal University and the Department of Higher Education, Rajganj College meticulously manages its admission process through a dedicated Admission Committee. Following the final merit list, the college ensures a transparent and merit-based admission process for both Honours and Program Courses. Our academic framework aligns with the directives of the Government of West Bengal, subsequently following the guidelines of North Bengal University. In the academic year 2023-2024, we are proud to have a faculty strength of 27 permanent teachers, with over half holding advanced qualifications such as PhD, NET, and SET.

To cultivate an informed learning environment, students receive the syllabus of their respective courses on the first day of class, establishing clear expectations and facilitating effective course comprehension. Leveraging technology, the college offers regular digital classes, enhancing the teaching-learning experience and promoting engagement.

In addition to traditional resources, our institution provides students with access to the N-list site, a vast digital repository offering a wide range of books, articles, magazines, and study materials. The library is equipped with KOHA ILMS, and the space is Wi-Fi enabled with CCTV surveillance in place. Recognizing diverse learning needs, we offer remedial classes, which have proven instrumental in addressing doubts, particularly for students requiring additional support.

The college maintains a rigorous evaluation process overseen by the Examination Committee, ensuring transparency and fairness. We employ a multifaceted approach to internal assessments, including group discussions, class tests, unit tests, paper presentations, assignments, viva-voce, and projects. Any grievances related to internal assessments are promptly and transparently addressed.

Guidelines concerning the implementation of the timetable, extra classes, remedial sessions, and internal assessments are formulated by the Academic Council in collaboration with the Heads of Departments. Progression to the next semester is determined through Semesters conducted by North Bengal University, reflecting our commitment to maintaining academic rigor and standards.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Rajganj College embodies a culture that fosters continuous learning, research, and innovation, creating an environment where faculty and management inspire and guide young minds. The college's commitment to research is evident through the active engagement of its teachers in ongoing research endeavors and scholarly publications.

With five faculty members holding doctoral degrees and several others progressing through their PhD coursework with affiliating and other universities, the college prioritizes and supports faculty development. Teaching loads are adjusted, and duty leaves are granted during doctoral programs to facilitate this. The college regularly organizes webinars, seminars, workshops, and lectures, inviting subject experts to share their insights. Faculty members are encouraged to participate in external seminars and contribute to scholarly publications,

including books with ISBN recognition. This balance between teaching commitments and research initiatives underscores the college's dedication to academic excellence and professional growth.

The college's enthusiasm for extension activities is palpable, with a range of programs designed to enrich both academic and cultural experiences for students. Annual events such as the Youth Parliament and poster presentations aim to foster scientific curiosity and innovation among students.

Our National Service Scheme (NSS) units play a pivotal role in fulfilling our social responsibilities, conducting numerous community welfare, health awareness, and environmental conservation programs over the past five years.

Additionally, the IQAC and Academic Council actively encourage faculty members to provide consultancy services to students, aiding them in career planning and development. Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Spanning across 10.11 acres, Rajganj College boasts a developing infrastructure designed to support both academic and extracurricular activities. With a total constructed area of 9105 sq/m, the college is equipped with a range of amenities to facilitate effective learning and development.

Our institution houses 15 spacious classrooms, complemented by a state-of-the-art virtual classroom or Smart Room equipped with advanced audio-visual systems, projectors, and Wi-Fi connectivity. All essential notifications are regularly updated and accessible through our fully functional website.

Classrooms are outfitted with essential teaching aids, including blackboards, tables, benches, and proper lighting, ensuring conducive learning environments. The Geography lab features contemporary facilities, providing students with hands-on learning experiences. With a dedicated IQAC Room and a total of 16 computers available for student use, the college offers LAN and Wi-Fi networks with a bandwidth of 100 MBPS, facilitated by our network provider, Alliance Broadband.

Our campus includes a playground, volleyball court, and designated areas for javelin throw and shot put, catering to both recreational and competitive sports activities.

The college library houses an extensive collection of reference books, textbooks, and newspapers. Additionally, faculty members benefit from N-LIST subscriptions, facilitating easy access to a plethora of online e-books and e-journals. The library is equipped with KOHA ILMS with RFID technology and features Wi-Fi and CCTV surveillance for enhanced security.

Other amenities include a roofed parking facility for two-wheelers, ensuring convenient commuting for students

and staff. The college infrastructure also comprises separate chambers for the Principal, IQAC, Administrative Office, Staff Room, and Girls' Common Room.

Prioritizing the well-being of our students and staff, the college offers filtered drinking water facilities across various corners and floors, supported by strategically placed water purifiers. Essential safety measures such as generators, solar photovoltaic devices, fire extinguishers, and CCTV surveillance ensure a secure and comfortable environment. Additional amenities like a well-equipped gym, canteen, and rainwater harvesting system further enhance the overall infrastructure, reflecting our commitment to fostering holistic development and well-being.

Student Support and Progression

Over the past five years, several of our alumni have earned their MA degrees, with many finding careers as educators in private schools and various sectors, while others have pursued entrepreneurial endeavors. To enhance students' employability, the college offers add-on courses focusing on basic ICT skills such as internet surfing, email communication, and online form filling.

Maintaining strong connections with our alumni, the college fosters active engagement through an Alumni Association, facilitating mentorship and career guidance opportunities.

Basic Infrastructural Facilities

Rajganj College covers **40913.718 square meters,** providing ample space for academics and extracurricular activities. This includes academic buildings and outdoor areas for sports, gatherings, and student activities, highlighting the college's commitment to a comprehensive educational experience. With a built-up area of **9105.427 square meters,** the college offers substantial facilities, blending academic rigor with extracurricular engagement in a spacious and conducive environment.

Safety and Surveillance:

The college has a fire extinguishing system for emergency preparedness. 24 CCTV cameras are strategically placed across the campus, enhancing security and monitoring. This extensive surveillance network deters misconduct and ensures the safety of students, staff, and visitors. The commitment to safety is evident in the thorough planning and implementation of these measures, creating a secure learning environment.

Sustainable and Environmental Initiatives:

A **40 KW** rooftop solar panel system reduces the college's carbon footprint. The rainwater harvesting system conserves water by collecting and utilizing rainwater efficiently. Waste management systems ensure proper segregation and disposal, minimizing environmental impact.

Classrooms and Additional Facilities

Rajganj College features 15 classrooms, each under CCTV surveillance to ensure a safe learning environment. These classrooms facilitate effective teaching and learning. The college has a dedicated hall room for seminars and cultural programs, fostering academic discourse and cultural enrichment. Two virtual rooms with projectors provide modern teaching aids for interactive sessions. The Geography lab offers hands-on practical learning experiences, and the well-resourced library supports academic needs with a vast collection of books. The college has a power generator for uninterrupted power supply during outages and a sick room on campus for immediate medical attention.

ICT Facilities

The college provides 16 computers for student use, 8 for general use, and 2 for teaching purposes. There are 3 projectors available for instructional use. Wi-Fi connectivity with a bandwidth of 100 MBPS is provided through Alliance Broadband. The college possesses 3 laptops, 8 desktops, 10 UPS units, and 7 printers.

One room is specially equipped with LCD projectors, a screen, and a sound system. Two computers are placed in the IQAC room, one in the teachers' common room, and six in the administrative block. Two laptops are used for seminars, presentations, and workshops. Advanced photocopiers, printers, and scanners are available for administrative and academic tasks.

The library has 3 computers, one for the librarian and two for the circulation desk. The N-LIST facility offers access to e-journals, e-books, and other e-learning resources. Faculty members are registered on the VIDWAN portal for better academic connectivity. The college maintains a fully functional website managed by "Easy Solution," with an annual maintenance contract.

Cultural Activities & Sports:

The hall room, equipped with a sound system and projector, accommodates numerous attendees for events. The college has a well-equipped gymnasium supporting students' physical well-being. Students actively participate in district and state-level championships, bringing laurels to the college. Rajganj College's infrastructure supports academic excellence, safety, sustainability, extracurricular engagement, and holistic student development.

Rajganj College's Library, situated on the ground floor, is a vital academic resource managed by the Librarian and a dedicated team, guided by the Library Committee. Spanning an 1800 square feet area, the library is designed with a modular approach, separating various sections to enhance usability. These sections include the Registration & Circulation Desk, Text Book Section, Reference Section, Student and Teacher Reading sections, Online Learning Cubicles, Journal and Magazine Corners, Special Collection, Technical Section, Librarian's Cabin, Reprography, and a Baggage Corner. The layout is intended to provide a conducive learning environment with proper lighting, ventilation, water supply, and uninterrupted power.

Physical Infrastructure

Equipped with 34+ nos. of comfortable & ergonomic chair, and wider tables to encourage a healthy learning environment, by ensuring proper light, ventilation, fans, water, and uninterrupted power supply. The library is under CCTV surveillance. It is powered by wi-fi connectivity.

Automation and Technology

The library is partially automated. The library has KOHA (Version 23.11.02.000) ILMS integrated with an RFID facility. This upgrade includes an RFID Gate, a self-circulation kiosk, stock verification, and a rack search system with an RFID Handle Reader. These enhancements improve the security and management of library resources, streamline daily operations, and maintain the library's efficiency.

Collection and Access

The library preserved and provides a varied, authoritative, and up-to-date collection of 6117+ books covering various subjects, including syllabus-oriented Text and Reference books with an open access facility. Resources are organized according to call numbers using the DDC 19th edition for Class Number.

Enhanced Academic Resources

Since April 2022, the library has provided access to N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content), enriching the academic resources available to users.
